On 8 September 2023, NSW Deputy State Coroner Magistrate Harriet Grahame finalised the inquest into the death of BW

The Deputy State Coroner made a total of nine recommendations under the provisions of section 82 of the *Coroners Act 2009*. Six of the recommendations are made to the NSW Police Force (NSWPF) and two are joint recommendations made to the NSWPF and the NSW Department of Communities and Justice.

These recommendations, along with the NSWPF position on each of the recommendations, are included in the attached table.
