About the program

Newpin is a free service specialising in restoration through a therapeutic lens for both children and parents.

Newpin is funded by Department of Communities and Justice under a performance-based contract until September 2027.

Newpin programs includes:

- Supported family time to assist parents in putting learning into practice
- Parenting education program
- Therapeutic support group
- Therapeutic play
- Regular reports to referrers on the families progress with reflections by parents.

32% of Newpin families are Aboriginal

Successful program completion for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families is consistent compared to non-Aboriginal families

Newpin Practice Framework



Eligibility criteria

- Families with at least one child under the age of 6
- The family has been assessed as suitable for restoration
- Child/ren are in statutory OOHC for least three months (or will be)
- The parent/s can attend a Newpin centre twice a week
- Children to be restored are able to attend Newpin once a minimum of week with their parent/s.

Referrals to the program

DCJ and NGO caseworkers are encouraged to refer eligible single parents and couples

DCJ Caseworker can refer within ChildStory by creating a 'New Service Request' and then selecting 'request an external referral'.
