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## 1. Purpose of the User Guide

## **1.1 Introduction**

The Restrictive Practices Authorisation (RPA) User Guide (the User Guide) has been developed to assist NDIS Registered Service Providers (Service Providers) and Behaviour Support Practitioners (Practitioners) navigate the NSW (DCJ) RPA System (the System) in order to implement and comply with the RPA Policy and Procedural Guide. The User Guide aims to provide the link between policy and practice.

The NSW Restrictive Practices Authorisation System User Guide *Part 6: Dashboard and Reports* takes users through the functions of the Dashboard, and explains how to download reports with data specific to your Organisation from the System.

The User Guide has been updated and divided into 6 parts to allow users easier access to information. Each part is related to specific steps within the RPA System, therefore *Part 6: Dashboard and Reports* should be read in conjunction with Parts 1 - 5 (see the following page).

This User Guide will be progressively updated as additional functions are added to the System.

Throughout the User Guide, **BEST PRACTICE SUGGESTIONS** have been included that your organisation may wish to use when establishing RPA processes.

## 2. The Dashboard

The Dashboard has been developed to provide summary information and key metrics regarding restrictive practices entered in the RPA System for each Service Provider.

There are several ways to navigate to the Dashboard within the RPA System - via the Home page and through the Dashboard tab in the Menu bar.

#### New Feature: Behaviour Support Plan Expiry Date

A new field has been added to Section 2. Restrictive Practice Category of the Submission form. This field is used to record the expiry date of the Behaviour Support Plan. This information is required before the Submission can be released.

Under the policy, the RPA Expiry Date cannot be after the expiry date of the Behaviour Support Plan. The information in this new field will alert you if you try to release an Outcome Summary with an RPA Expiry Date that exceeds the expiry date of the Behaviour Support Plan.

#### New System Upgrades

The NSW RPA system has been upgraded! The new version incorporates upgrades, new features and modifications in accordance with development plans and feedback received from users. A description of the new enhancements can be found under the <u>Help</u> menu of the RPA System.

#### enAble RPA

What is it? enAble RPA is an enabling tool. It has been designed to empower and support the NSW disability sector to recognise and appropriately respond to restrictive practices. START the Senior Practitioner, Disability in Victoria, developed.

This report provides the total number of restrictive practices across your Organisation by Submission Type and Submission Category.

#### Submissions By Status/Disability

This report provides the total number of Submissions in your Organisation by Submission Status, and by Primary Disability. Please note that the status and the Primary Disability information appears on separate sheets in Excel.

#### • Submissions by Behaviour of Concern (BoC)

This report lists all Behaviours of Concern identified via Submissions for your Organisation, and provides the total number of Submissions and Proposed Restrictive Practices per BoC.

#### • Submissions by Service Provider

This report provides the total number of Participants, Submissions, and Proposed Restrictive Practices for your Organsiation, with a further breakdown into Branches if applicable.

#### • Outcome Summary By Status

This report provides a breakdown of the Outcome Summaries generated by your Organisation by Status.

#### Review Report

This report lists all Reviews conducted by your Organisation. The data shows the participant details, submission and outcome summary details and includes the data entered in the review fields. This report is useful if you want to identify how many restrictive practices have been withdrawn, and the withdrawal reason.

#### • Panel Meeting Report

This report provides details of all RPA Panel meetings convened by your Organsiation.
