SHLV Program - Overview




SHLV is a specialised domestic and family violence program aimed at promoting victim-survivor's housing stability and preventing their homelessness.

The SHLV service model is based on intensive case work, which is long-term, needs-based and integrated with key agencies such as NSW Police, Women's Domestic Violence Court Advocacy Services (WDVCAS), health services, Housing NSW and relevant NGOs.

SHLV aims to:

- Complement existing services and to operate in collaboration and coordination with existing services.
- Prevent the occurrence of post-separation abuse.

Existing services include 39 Contracts across 32 Service providers in 91 LGAs.



SHLV Program - Overview



This new round of SHLV procurement in 2024 seeks to secure up to 14 services to cover 28 LGAs where there is currently no service delivery or limited service delivery, including:


- 10 services in the open tender, and
- 4 services in the single invited tender.

Funding profile:

- Total contract value of \$25.9 million for over 4 years in this round.
- The remainder of the DFV emergency package will expand IDFVS and Aboriginal co-design models.

Procurement Objectives:

- Open the market to new providers through competitive procurement.
- Expand availability to areas that are not currently available across NSW.
- Deliver service expansion quickly to meet areas of demand.
- Increase Aboriginal service delivery.
- Committing to long contracts for providers.



New Services via tender

Service locations and funding



As this is an emergency funding package, the design of the expansion has been modelled on getting the funding to services as quickly as possible. Extending existing SHLV services in some locations and going to market for new services will allow for the fastest roll out of the funding in the most practical way.

Locations consider more than DFV rates and demand, there has been significant supply analysis to understanding the changing provider landscape.

SHLV expansion required increasing services by LGA and we have grouped LGAs to make the service offering appropriate for the locations. The locations have been identified through consultation with districts and reflect market analysis information.

Expansion has been based on thorough mapping of gap areas as well as considering demand data and BOCSAR data.

We recognise that rural remote and regional areas face particular challenges in service delivery and have allocated funding to account for this complexity of environment.

Increasing Aboriginal led DFV service delivery is important in all our programs. Where have been able to identify Aboriginal providers with experience and capacity we are offering single invited tenders for these locations.

SHLV Program – Service Model



The SHLV service model delivers intensive case work, which is **long-term, needs-based and integrated with key agencies** such as NSW Police, health services, housing, and relevant non-government organisations including services delivering WDVCAS, women's refuges and Safer Pathway.

Successful tenderers will be offered an initial contract term of **4 years and 3 months**, plus 2-year option to extend. This is in line with NSW Government commitment for funding certainty and longer contracts.

The core service provided through SHLV is **DFV case management**. In addition to case management, SHLV services are contracted to provide:

SHLV Program – Target group



The target population for SHLV is women aged over 18 years who have separated from a violent partner or family member and who wish to remain in their own home, or another home of their choice. The SHLV program also supports clients' children.

SHLV prioritises services for women from identified target populations that are more vulnerable to DFV and who may find it more difficult to access support. This includes:

women and children from an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander background

women and children affected by socio-economic disadvantage

women and children from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds

women and children affected by social exclusion

women with disability

women who are caring for a child with disability

SHLV Procurement - Objective



This round of SHLV seeks to identify service providers that will be suitable for delivering services in the 27 LGAs identified in the previous section from 1 April 2025 to 30 September 2029 (4 years and 3 months) with option to extend another 2 years.



SHLV Procurement - Process



Single stage: Request for Tender (RFT)

Two concurrent processes: Open tender and Single invited tender

RFT Returnable Schedules to be submitted in the Procurement Central Platform (section 4)

The RFT is comprised of two evaluation stages:

- Conformance Check review that mandatory information has been provided and eligibility criteria has been met. If not, then the application may not progress to the next evaluation stage.
- Evaluation Assessment undertaken by a Tender Evaluation Committee, including value for money assessment. Clarifications may be sought from the Respondents, details including timeframe and format will be provided in the Request for Clarifications.

Evaluation Criteria - Overview



Weighted and scored:

- Criterion 1 Demonstrated experience in trauma-informed case management and coordination services.
- Criterion 2 Demonstrated experience and cultural capability to work with priority groups.
- **Criterion 3** Demonstrated experience delivering DFV specialist services in the local service delivery area and/or partnerships.
- Criterion 4 Integration of services with local service system.
- Criterion 5 Annual Budget / Cost efficiency
- Criterion 6 Modern Slavery requirement

Non-weighted but scored as part of Value for Money assessment:

- Small Medium Enterprises
- Aboriginal Organisations and Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations
- Workforce proficiency / SCHADS Award
- Responsiveness for SHLV Program service delivery and flexibility
