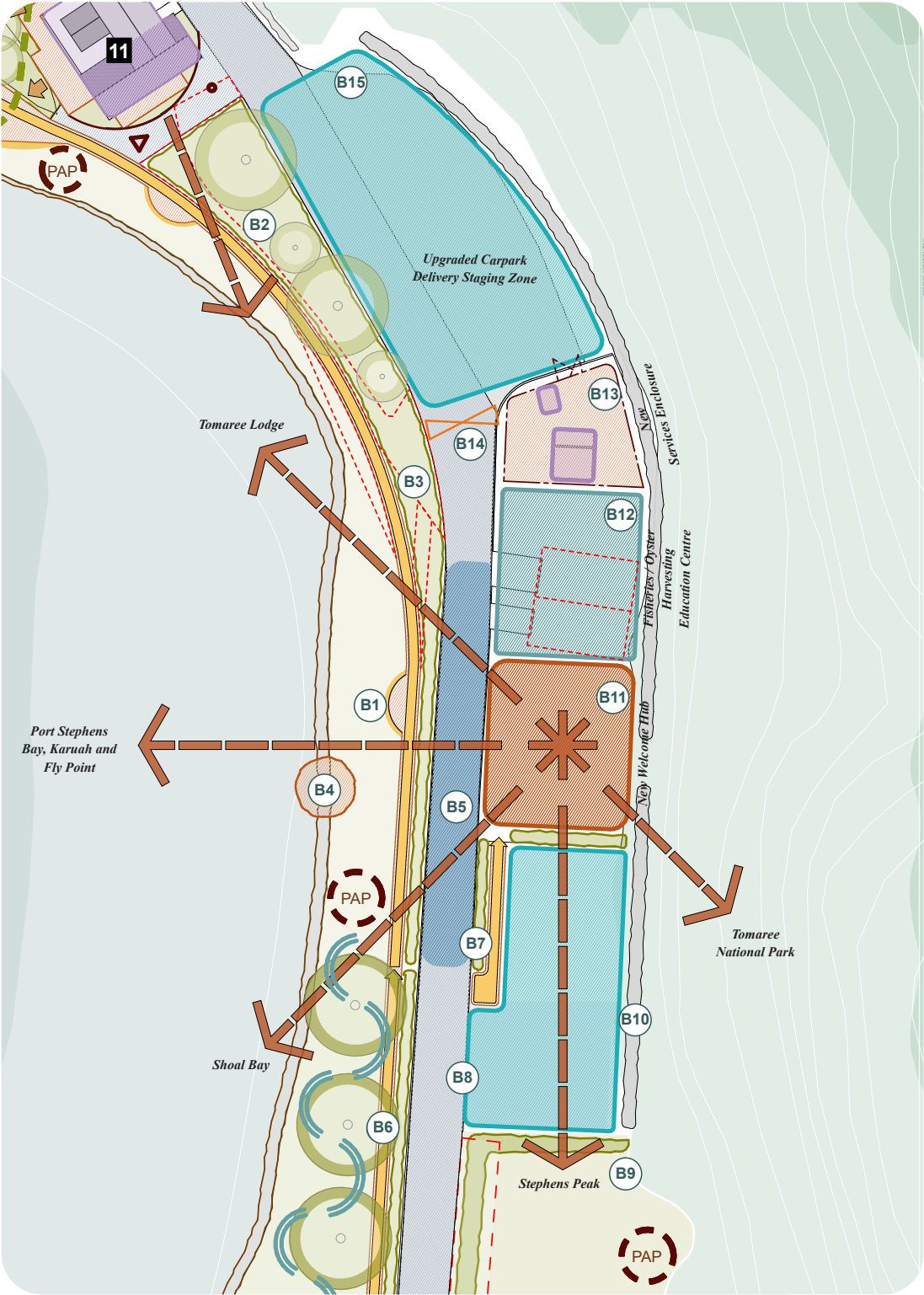


The Masterplan for the renewal of Tomaree Lodge

B. Checkpoint



- B1** Provide a range of dedicated nodal points along path to educate and pause points. Consultation with Worimi on wayfinding and interpretive signage initiatives to be explored.
- B2** Small pocket native garden with 2 x large Bunya Pines to be protected and integrated with new landscape strategy.
- B3** Remove dual road access point and relocate separate vehicle and pedestrian traffic. Refer to the 'Civic' drawing for new vehicle link.
- B4** Break in seawall to allow equitable beach access to sheltered / sandy beach in low tide. A chance to get your feet wet'.
- B5** Shared slow traffic calming zone to promote pedestrian friendly movement.
- B6** Clearly identifiable shared bike and pedestrian pathway along foreshore edge and integrated with landscape solution.
- B7** Removal of dieback palms and replace with endemic planting.
- B8** Existing carpark available for accessible parking, shuttle services and short term stay.
- B9** Dominant framed view of Stephens Peak. Deeply connecting visitors to the whole context of the multiple mountains.
- B10** Gabion blue stone retaining walls have a limited lifespan. Replace and upgrade using local stone from country and included drainage solutions.
- B11** A new tourist hub including information centre, public displays, education office, point of sale including, but not limited to NPSW, Worimi, Fisheries / Marine Park, and/or Heritage and Ecology Centre.
- B12** Potential for DPI 'Fisheries' / Oyster Harvesting Centre to move to the front of the Site, as a strong educational centre to complement the Welcome Hub.
- B13** Defined site services compound with access off carpark. To be screened and fire-rated.
- B14** New control point for guests, staff, researchers, service providers and tours.
- B15** Maintain existing car parking for controlled use by staff, guests and deliveries.
