

The Masterplan for the renewal of Tomaree Lodge

F. Convergence



- F1 Timber retaining wall and concrete path on incline with galvanised handrail needs repair and stabilisation. Make compliant and easily accessible for users and offer a more aesthetic approach as part of an integrated landscape solution.
- F2 Short link to National Park Road and walking trails if needed (to be coordinated with NPWS).
- F3 Upgrade amenities for public use including the picnic and BBQ shelter. Activate the space with new, functional and accessible facilities as part of a site sensitive solution.
- F4 Seawater supply pump and line with water storage and tanks behind shed. If Fisheries remain use this as an education tool, to inform visitors on the process and make it visually appealing.
- F5 Cool rooms in compound hardstand, with a fence enclosure. If Fisheries remain in this location, replace the fence with a pattern mural or art piece which reflects the native surrounds.
- F6 New picnic bench and shelter. Existing gabion wall is to be removed and replace with landscape battening.
- F7 If DPI Fisheries remain in this location there is a strong opportunity to create public visibility and provide an interactive interface. Alternatively, if Fisheries move to the 'Checkpoint' precinct. This space is to become a landscape recreation area.
- F8 Existing street lights - there are a series of mis-match lights across site. A new uniform lighting layout for continuity and to be ecologically sensitive, low glare and part of electronic wayfinding solution.
- F9 Long, organic and landscape imagined tiered seating and gathering space between the promenade and the picnic terrace.
- F10 Existing remnants of historic bathing enclosure to be protected.
- F11 Opportunity to reinstate Harbour Ocean Baths enclosure. Allowing visitors to connect with land, sea and sky. (This is not within of the site boundary and is a future extension opportunity).
