If you need help now there are other support services that can help you.



The **Child Protection Helpline** can help if you are worried about the safety of a child.



You can call them on 13 21 11.



The **Kids Helpline** gives free support on the phone to young people from 5 to 25 years old.

**Law Access NSW** can give you legal information and support to find legal help.

The **Disaster Welfare Assistance Line** can help if you have been through a **disaster**.



A **disaster** is when something bad happens like a big fire or flood.



You can call the Disaster Welfare Assistance Line on 1800 018 444.




The **Domestic Violence Line** can support you if you are a woman going through **domestic violence**.



**Domestic violence** is when a partner or family member hurts you.

**Abuse** is when someone hurts you very bad.



**Neglect** is when someone does not give you the care you need.



**Exploitation** is when someone uses you to get something from you like money.

**Jury Service Enquiries** can answer any questions you have about being in a **jury**.



A **jury** is a group of people in court who decide if someone is guilty or innocent.

The **NSW Sexual Violence Helpline** gives free support to anyone who has been through **sexual assault.** 



**Sexual assault** is when someone does sexual things to you that you do not want.

The Rainbow Sexual Domestic and Family Violence Helpline supports LGBTQA+ people who have been through domestic or family violence.



**LGBTQA+** means the different ways people can love and feel about who they are.

**Step Together** gives support to stop people doing very bad things like **terrorist attacks**.



A **terrorist attack** is when someone tries to hurt people for what they believe in.
