The Child Overview provides individual level information relating to the children that you have case management responsibility for. Information contained within this tool looks at the areas in a child's life including:

- Safety (Safety)
- Belonging & Stability (Permanency)
- Wellbeing (split into five subdomains)
  - Intellectual Potential
  - Good Health and Development
  - Emotional & Psychological Wellbeing
  - Social Functioning
  - Cultural & Spiritual Identity

The aim of the Child Overview is to provide a single point of information for agencies & caseworkers to create a picture of how a child or young person is faring, so it can be used to help identify how a child's outcomes can be improved.



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

**12 Months Ending September 2017**



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


SDQ -Total Difficulties Score
