

Who we are

Psychological and Specialist Services (Child Protection and Permanency) is an integral part of the Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ). We strive to improve outcomes for children and young people connected to child protection and out-of-home care systems. We provide evidence-based, trauma-informed assessments and interventions to support the wellbeing, functioning and stability of children and young people. We also guide casework practice through consultation and training, and provide specialised training and support to carers. Whether you're an experienced clinician, provisional psychologist, registrar or student, your work with us will make a lasting and meaningful impact on the lives of vulnerable children, young people and families.

Our structure

District and Intensive Psychological Services teams - teams across the state provide assessment, intervention, consultation and training to children and young people, families, carers and caseworkers.

LINKS Trauma Healing Service - a multidisciplinary trauma service located in select areas across NSW, supporting placement stability and positive outcomes for kids in out-of-home care.

Strategy and Projects - a specialist team delivering service insights and projects across the state, including targeted training and resources for carers and professionals.

Provisional Psychologist Program

The DCJ Provisional Psychologist Program provides supervision, skill building opportunities and support to achieve full registration as per AHPRA requirements. We provide opportunities to meet core competencies and case study requirements, and build knowledge for the National Psychology Exam.

Registrar Program

The DCJ Registrar Program offers specialist supervision, providing opportunities for staff to meet specialist endorsement requirements with AHPRA. We provide resources, ongoing opportunities for training and group supervision to support professional development.

Student placements

We offer rich placement experiences for Master of Professional Practice, Forensic Psychology and Clinical Psychology students.
